Submission Preparation Checklist

As part of the submission process, authors are required to check off their submission's compliance with all of the following:

- Word count: 6,000 to 8,000. Microsoft Word document file format. The text is double-spaced; Aptos, 12-point font, block paragraph; employs italics, rather than underlining (except with URL addresses); and all illustrations, figures, and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points, rather than at the end. When available, the URLs to access references online are provided, including those for open access versions of the reference. Abstract: 200 words. Keywords.
- Citation: American Psychological Association (APA) citation format, 7th edition. Authors are expected to observe proper citation and acknowledge the sources of materials used in their manuscripts including those which are AI-generated or assisted. See APA Guidance on ChatGPT & Other AI Generative Tools.
- Copyright and Permission: The full submission has not been previously published, nor is it before another journal for consideration. Securing necessary permission for copyrighted materials used in the article is the responsibility of the authors. The authors give the Journal the right to publish their articles in print and online.
